

Starting Your Journey With God

God has placed it on my heart to share His message with you, and this card was created as a short guide to help you on your journey with Him. Whether you're just beginning to explore the Bible or have been reading it for some time. I pray that God blesses you, strengthens your relationship with Him, and reveals the richness and spiritual truths found in His Word. Before reading Scripture, take a moment to say this simple praver:

"LORD, grant me wisdom so that I may understand your words and come closer to You. In Jesus' name I prav. Amen."

Start with the Gospel of Mark to learn about Jesus Christ, His miracles, death, and resurrection. After Mark, read Genesis to understand the beginning of everything-creation, the first humans, the entry of sin, and its consequences. Genesis also details the Great Flood, a significant event remembered by many ancient cultures.

Topline Overview

The Bible's story is simple: It's about a King (God), His kingdom, and His children (us) who are lost. Out of love. He sent His Son, Jesus, to save us and bring us back to Him. One day, Jesus will return to remove all sin, evil, and death, and we will live with Him forever.

- Old Testament: God shows we cannot be saved through the law and our actions.
- New Testament: Jesus' death and resurrection fulfills the law and brings salvation through faith.

Salvation

We are saved through faith in Jesus Christ, not by our actions. Through faith, we are declared saved, and God begins a lifelong process of shaping us to reflect His ways. Believers are called to repent, turn away from sin, and obey His commandments-when we fall short, God's grace forgives us and helps us get back on track. Jesus calls us to deny ourselves [let go of sinful desires], take up our cross [choose God's ways], and follow Him daily (Luke 9:23). Good works flow from salvation. These good works are the result of being saved, and are not the cause of salvation. When we put our faith in Jesus Christ, we are made spiritually new [born again], and God will guide us in our daily walk with Him, shaping us to grow closer to Him and reflect His character. THE DAYS TO COME

Scripture speaks of the last days, comparing them to the days of Noah (Matthew 24:37-39). In Noah's time, the world was filled with wickedness, sin was rampant, and people turned away from God. Because of this. God brought the Great Flood to cleanse the earth. Similarly, the world will continue falling away from God in the days to come. Can you see how this is happening in the world today? We see this in wars and conflicts increasing across nations. devastating natural disasters (Matthew 24:6-7, 24:21-22), moral decay where good is called evil and evil is called good (1 Timothy 3:1-5), deceptions and false teachings leading many astray, and increasing hostility toward God's truth. The final book of the Bible. Revelation, describes the Great Tribulation—a period of severe iudgment and global turmoil. It describes additional signs, including economic instability, plagues, famine, war, the persecution of believers, and the growing rejection of God's Word (Revelation 8: 13:16-17; 18:8). Those who turn away from God will reject His message of repentance, love, and salvation, which has been shared with you (2 Thessalonians 2:1-15).

My hope is that you strengthen your relationship with God. I write this letter to you as a loving friend, though my love will always fall short and can never match the love God has had for you all your life. Remember, if you ever feel unsure or have questions, seek wisdom through prayer, Scripture, or a trusted fellow believer. God's Word will always guide you.

Christ warns that false prophets will arise, claiming to be Him (Matthew 24:21-31), for the devil disguises himself as an angel of light and will deceive many in the days to come (2 Corinthians 11:14). Despite these deceptions, Jesus assures us of His triumphant return, which will be unlike anything the world has ever witnessed. He will <u>descend from the sky</u> and <u>lift His believers</u> to be with Him <u>in the air</u> (1 Thessalonians 4:15-17). Until that day, <u>believe no one who</u> claims to be Christ, and remain vigilant in your walk with Him.

Even during these times, trust in God's love. Stay strong in your faith, knowing His strength will sustain you through every challenge, and He will never leave you, no matter what happens.
